

## **Don't let the school run cost your child's safety**

Mornings are a busy time. From putting together lunch boxes to getting the kids to school, the last thing you want to worry about is parking.

After a busy journey, parking on the zig-zag lines outside the school gates can seem like an easy option, but what you might not realise is that doing so can put children's safety in danger.

Every time you park on zig-zag markings you are risking a child's life.

Could you justify not parking somewhere else if a child was killed because they couldn't see past your vehicle or be seen by other road users?



### **So what do the zig-zag lines mean?**

They are the equivalent of a loading ban which means that you can't even stop on them to drop off or pick up your children. They are considered a very high-risk area so abuse of these parking restrictions is taken very seriously.

### **Don't let the school run cost you....**

Parking on zig-zag lines can result in you being issued with an instant Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) for £70 which is another reason to find somewhere safe to park. Driving away whilst a Civil Enforcement Officer takes your vehicle details will not save you from being issued with a PCN as local authorities now have the power to send PCNs to motorists through the post.
